## IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

Este informe contiene información muy importante sobre su agua potable.

### **Diablo Grande Water System has levels of Disinfection Byproducts Above Drinking Water Standards**

Our water system recently failed a drinking water standard. Although this is not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what you should do, what happened, and what we are doing to correct this situation.

We routinely monitor our water system for the presence of drinking water contaminants. Testing results from October 17, 2013 to January 5, 2017 show that our system exceeded the standard or maximum contaminant level for Total Trihalomethane [TTHM]. The maximum level for TTHM is 80 parts per billion. It is determined by the Locational Running Annual Average [LRAA] of samples collected at each sampling location, quarterly, over past 12 months. The LRAA levels of TTHM samples collected at two sample locations were 111 parts per billion and 107 parts per billion respectively.

#### **What should I do?**

- **You do not need to use an alternative (e.g. , bottled) water supply.**
- This is not an immediate risk. If it had been, you would have been notified immediately. However, *some people who use water containing trihalomethanes in excess of the MCL over many years may experience liver, kidney, or central nervous system problems, and may have an increased risk of getting cancer.*
- If you have other health issues concerning the consumption of this water, you may wish to consult your doctor.

#### **What happened? What was done?**

WHWD has completed a project in mid January 2017 to install equipment at the Zone 3 Tank to reduce the TTHMs to acceptable levels.

You can do this by posting this notice in a public place or distributing copies by hand or mail.*

#### **Secondary Notification Requirements**

Upon receipt of notification from a person operating a public water system, the following notification must be given within 10 days [Health and Safety Code Section 116450(g)]:

- **SCHOOLS:** Must notify school employees, students, and parents (if the students are minors).
- **RESIDENTIAL RENTAL PROPERTY OWNERS OR MANAGERS** (including nursing homes and care facilities): Must notify tenants.
- **BUSINESS PROPERTY OWNERS, MANAGERS, OR OPERATORS:** Must notify employees of businesses located on the property.
